District Governor visits Henley on Klip Lions Club









Fellow Lions – Below is some important information regarding the Blind Navigators' Rallies, sent in by the BNRC Lions Representative, Lion Patrick Mills.

Regularity Rallying is a safe, low cost, and exciting competitive motor sport. The idea is for a two-person crew (driver and navigator) to drive along a route set by the organisers on public tar roads. The crew must keep to the set speeds shown on the route schedule, which are always below the prevailing speed limit. The organisers calculate the precise time you should arrive at any point on the route if you kept to the exact set speeds. Your drive along the route is logged by a GPS logger. The organisers clock your car at various points along the route and penalise you for any time early or late at those points. A typical one day rally will be about 200km long.

The Blind Navigators Series is a unique sport that not only encourages blind participants but puts them in a position of control as the route schedules are all in Braille. The re-introduction of a rally series for blind navigators came about at the beginning of 2005, thanks to the social-responsibility action of Total SA and Lions International, together with SARRA (the South African Regularity Rally Association). The series is run at the lowest possible cost to the participants, and we are able to fulfil a great need amongst disadvantaged members of our community.

As a driver you will need your own reliable, roadworthy car and sufficient petrol for the event. The following will be provided to you free of charge if you don't have your own: digital kitchen clock, fire extinguisher and a warning triangle. The entry fee per rally is typically R100. You will also need to hire a GPS logger from the organisers @ R100 (if you don't have your own). Costs can be shared equally between driver and navigator. You may also be asked to assist in collecting and dropping off blind navigators from your area. Remember to bring your patience, a cool head and a sense of humour – you are competing for the fun of it and it is a fun project.

REDUCE RE-USE RECYCLE is the message *the LIONS CLUB OF WILRO PARK* promotes on the streets of the Community in which they serve - Lions branded Safety Jackets, running shoes, socks, sunglasses, caps and beanies are handed out to the Waste Pickers who recycle plastic, cardboard and tins.

These are the Recyclers who work the streets from the early hours of the morning until late into the day, sorting, collecting and transporting, on their mostly homemade trolleys, the things home owners throw away, often they walk long distances to the waste dumps and depots to earn a living to put food on the table.

In addition the Community are also encouraged to help by supporting the Lions Club of Wilro Park by depositing glass in the glass bank located at the Lions Community Centre. The public are encouraged to support the "DONATE THE **SHOES THAT YOU DON'T USE" PROJECT – the Lions** Club of Wilro Park Collection bins are placed at the various sports and running clubs in the area and runners assist by donating their pre-used but still good running shoes and in some cases brand new running shoes, we have added socks, caps and sunglasses to our appeal to try and make life a little easier for the guys doing a tough job! This important Lions Project has received a lot of attention through Social Media and the Newspapers within our community including messages of thanks from the Ward Councillors thanking the Club for restoring dignity to the guys on our streets.
