Our vision for the year is; " Increase service through networking with all charity organisations and donors."



Important Message regarding the Covid-19 Virus From the DC for Lions Alert, To All Lions and Leo Clubs Multiple District 410.

Good day,

Basic protective measurements against the Coronavirusv19

As Lions and Leos Clubs it's important for all of us to be calm and operates as normal. It's important not to share fake news. Make sure of the resources you use and reference. Share information responsible. Keep the precautions in mind when prepared for a project.

The National and Provincial authorities will have the most up to date information on the situation in the area and community you are serving. Make it part of your Club's Safety and Alert Coordinators role.

Lions and Leos must take care of their health and protect the communities we serve.

Lions and Leo Clubs can follow the following steps Hygiene at a Lions Clubhouse and Meetings

Don't do handshakes.

Don't use hand towels in clubs rooms. Rather use a dryer or paper towels and discard into a bin with a bag in.

Ise a 60% alcohol based hand sanitizer when arriving at home or clubhouse or wash your hands.

I Keep a 60% alcohol based hand sanitizer at the entrance of your home or club house.







- P As well in your vehicle.
- ☑ Wash your hands with soap for 10 20 seconds frequently.
- Those who work with money must wash their hands frequently.
- I Keeping a box of tissues at the club house is a good idea to.
- Don't use the same water to wash your hands that has been used by others ie a bucket where others have already their hands.

Public places

- Used your knuckle to touch light switches, elevators buttons etc.
 Use disinfectant wipes at stores when they are available I Wipe the handle of trolleys and child seat in groceries carts.
- Lions and Leo Projects
- Provide the second s
- Wash your hands before and after preparing food
- Clean and disinfect objects and surfaces that are frequently touched
- Wash your hands between handling raw and cooked food
 General Hygiene
- If someone coughs, keep at least 1 meter from him or her to protect yourself. If you are too close you could breathe in the droplets.
- Avoid close contact with anyone who is coughing and sneezing.
 If you are coughing and sneezing stay at home, don't attend projects or club meetings.
- Wash hands after coughing or sneezing.





- If You can use sanitizers but it must be alcohol based with greater than 60% alcohol.
- Don't touch your face, specially eyes, nose and mouth.
- I Use your elbow only if you have to when you cough. The clothing on your elbow will contain infectious viruses that can be passed on for up to a week or more.
- If possible, open doors with your closed fist.
- Notes
- I The main precautions according all health departments are to have clean hands and keep them clean.
- I When we donate items to hunger projects ,major incidents, or other projects it is a good idea to add a bottle of sanitizer or soap with the goods. Remember it must be alcohol based with greater than 60% alcohol.
- I Let us as Lions Clubs think how we can contribute to the health of the vulnerable and poor; to protect them and to limit their exposure. I When clubs meet or socialize with other Lions clubs, let each one bring a bar of soap. It can be donated where the real need is.

PORT SHEPSTONE'S 50TH ANNIVERSARY

Port Shepstone Lions, Lion Ladies and their guests celebrated their Club's 50th Anniversary on Saturday 7th March during a glittering event held at *Port Shepstone Country Club*.

Hats off to the management and staff of Port Shepstone Country Club/Clubhouse Café for their excellent venue, superb service and outstanding cuisine as well as Jenny Vogt and her team from The Costume Shop for the beautifully decorated hall. During the past 50 years, Port Shepstone Lions have held many of their celebration events at the Country Club, including their 10th, 20th and 25th Anniversary Dinners so it was fitting that their 50th Anniversary celebration be held at the Club.

The whole event was organised and run by Past Council Chairman (Lion) Denis Meyer. Guests who attended included the Lions District 410E Governor, Alistair Tuckett, Lions Zone 11 Chairman Colin Mackintosh, Presidents of the Reitz Lions Club in the Freestate, Scottburgh Lions and Shelly Beach Lions as well as many members from these respective clubs. Other prominent guests included Mr Graeme Milligan, owner of Harbourview Superspar, Mr Michael Frey of Frey's Fresh Meat, South Coast Herald Reporter, Jenni Bipat, PSCC President John and Jay Beekman, The Pulse KZN Editor Sandy Danckwerts Rotary President Rowan and Joan D'Arcy and Round Table representative/Shelly Beach Skiboat Club Commodore Leon and Robyn Garbade. A number of past presidents and past members of the Port Shepstone Lions Club were also in attendance.

The real purpose of the celebration was to honour those members who, 50 years ago, decided to start the very first Lions Club chartered on the Lower South Coast and to celebrate the club's achievements. A special video presentation was shown by Lion Denis Meyer which provided a glimpse of 50 years of service and fellowship achieved by the Port Shepstone Lions.

At the beginning of 1970, Port Shepstone boasted a Rotary, a Round Table and a Bullslingers Club, however, a number of community minded individuals still felt the need to establish a Lions Club in the area. Members of the sponsoring club, Amanzimtoti Lions, together with the then Zone Chairman for Durban South, Lion Doug Hudson, and the District Club Extension Officer, Lion Ben Jacobs held a meeting with interested parties at the old Milton Hotel in Port Shepstone and, judging by the number of attendees and the strong interest shown, it was evident that a new Lions Club in the area would become a reality.

PORT SHEPSTONE'S 50TH ANNIVERSARY (Continued...)

The 1st charter dinner was held on Friday 24th April 1970 at the Milton Hotel in Port Shepstone. This glittering event was attended by leading businessmen from both Port Shepstone and Uvongo as well as a strong contingent of members from many Durban based Lions Clubs which included Amanzimtoti, Durban South, Westville, Durban Host, Kloof, North Durban and Pinetown. Lions District 410-C was formed the previous year and the district's very first Governor, Louis Halse was also in attendance together with the then mayor of Port Shepstone, Clr S Robinson.

During the formalities it was pointed out to the local community that Lions are a non-political, non-sectarian service organisation and that the purpose of a Lions Club is more than just good fellowship and social gatherings, it was to recognise the needs of the community and to develop the means of meeting these needs. These aims were welcomed by the Port Shepstone Mayor who believed that the growing community needed clubs of this nature.

Over the years this club has produced many District, Multiple District and International leaders which include several Zone Chairmen, District Chairmen, 5 District Governors and a Chairman of the Council of Governors. Port Shepstone Lions also went on to sponsor the chartering of the Margate, Scottburgh, Kokstad, Harding and Shelly Beach Lions Clubs. Two of these clubs still remain active to this day.

Port Shepstone Lions have successfully been running many large community projects for a number of years. These include:

Annual Blind Bowlers Tournament – 39 years Annual South Coast Lions Show – 34 years (up until 2018) Annual Lions Leadership Retreat – 35 years Monthly Lions Seniors Games Afternoons (previously bingo for the blind) – 29 years

Through these and literally hundreds of other projects, the club has reached out and improved the lives of literally thousands of needy individuals both locally and globally.

Today Port Shepstone Lions remains a strong, vibrant and active service club with a large membership and support base. The club's recent acquisition of a new clubhouse venue at Port Shepstone Country Club has further cemented the strong bonds between the two clubs who can both now look forward to many more community service activities and fundraising projects within the Port Shepstone Country Club precinct.

During his reply to the toast to the Lions Club of Port Shepstone, Club President Alister Love thanked members and Lion Ladies for their ongoing efforts in keeping the club active and successful. During his reply on behalf of Lions Clubs International, District Governor Alistair Tuckett who travelled from Johannesburg to attend, praised the Port Shepstone Lions and Lion Ladies for their ongoing commitment to serving the needy and for the spirit of friendship that exists within the club.

Appreciation plaques in recognition of ongoing sponsorship and support of the Club's community service projects were presented to Graeme Milligan, Michael Frey, Lothar Frey Family Trust, South Coast Herald and Port Shepstone Country Club. Friendship banners were also presented to District Governor Alistair Tuckett, Port Shepstone Country Club, Port Shepstone Rotary, Port Shepstone Round Table and the Presidents of Shelly Beach, Scottburgh and Reitz Lions Clubs.

The evening of celebration ended off with a photo shoot of all Past Presidents in attendance and the cutting of a birthday cake in recognition of 50 years of community service to the South Coast.

****PLEASE READ; IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL LEOS AND LION,***

FROM Neville van Rensburg MDC 410 for Lions Alert and Safety.

Dear Fellow Lions,

Re Summary of Regulations issued in terms of section 27(2) of the Disaster Management Act, 2002

This summary is of the new regulations issued in terms of the Disaster Act dated 17th March 2020 and I've extracted the portions which are directly related to us as a Lions Organisation and the areas applicable to our operations.

Definition: "Gathering" is defined as any assembly, concourse or procession of more than 100 persons wholly or partially in open air or in a building.

Prevention and prohibition of Gatherings: 3.

(1) In order to contain the spread of COVID-19, a gathering is prohibited.

(3) The assembly of more than 50 persons at a premises where liquor is sold and consumed is prohibited.

Suspension of visits: 7.

All visits by members of the public to:

(e) Department of Social Development facilities, including child and youth care centers, shelters, one stop centres and treatment centres are suspended for a period of 30 days from date of publication i.e. 17 March 2020.

Limitation on the sale, dispensing or transport of liquor: 8

(3) No special or events liquor licenses may be considered for approval during the duration of the national state of disaster.

Authority to issue direction:

10 (iii) Sourcing of human resources from expanded public works programmes retired health professionals and non-Government organizations to render services in identified sites.

Note: It is important that we as Lion and Leos look after ourselves and take all the precautionary steps. Clubs need to plan extremely carefully in this crisis time as to how they still can support, without risk themselves and others.
