Every year our club look forward to our "*Christmas in July*". What a better time to reach out to the needy in this cold weather and to see the joy in faces, a tear running down a check with a speechless thank you in the eye, We all know every day is a challenge for the needed and less fortunate, but winter brings extra challenges which I think you will only understand once you had to find a spot in the cold to try and stay warm or had to explain to a child that you don't have food for a hungry tummy, nor something to keep your child warm and protected in this winter times. What better time to reach out and make a difference…? This turns the Covid-19 challenges we need to deal with into small obstacles.

Thanks to *L Patrick and our club donations* we had enough money to purchase food for 40 families and *Acorn Foundation* who donated another 3 hampers as part of our **Mandela day projects**. Our club has identified 20 struggling families in Olievenhoutbosch that we donated much-needed food, and we identified another 20 families in Centurion that we could also assist

with food.

Lion Sue accompanied Lee-Anne, mom of *Johnathan* to the appointment with the specialist **Dr Gouws**, who examined Johnathan who suffered trauma to his eye as a baby and now suffers from headaches, double vision and he has a large fatty deposit which has developed under his eyelid as a result of the trauma over the years.

Dr Gouws advised that he is certain that he can remove it successfully and Johnathan's sight should be restored, if not immediately, in a short space of time.

The total cost of the operation was initially estimated at R80,000, however, Dr Gouws, the anaesthetist and the Pretoria Eye Institute have given us preferential rates after negotiating with them and the total estimated cost is now just under R31,000. However, we would like to try and arrange for accommodation the night before and the night after the operation, so that the Doctor can examine Johnathan post op, and we would like to ensure that the medication prescribed is covered, and Johnathan needs to have the Covid Test done prior to the procedure (R850) so we are trying to raise R35,000

Our club covered the consultation and has pledged a minimum of R5000 towards the fund. .



SIX TIPS FOR ORGANIZING A PEACE POSTER CONTEST DURING COVID-19

For more than 30 years, Lions around the world have sponsored the Lions International Peace Poster Contest in schools and organized youth groups in their communities.

This year, as we may forward with the 2020, 21 competition, "Peace Through Service," we fee

This year, as we move forward with the 2020-21 competition, "Peace Through Service," we face a new challenge of hosting the contest safely during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. **Lions** have been serving and connecting safely through social distancing, Zoom meetings, social media and more, and we encourage you to continue being safe as you sponsor the Peace Poster Contest.

Consider the following tips: Email or call your school or youth group leaders to check in, confirm their participation in this year's contest and offer your support. Encourage schools conducting e-learning to participate by providing rules and instructions online. Students can then complete their posters at home and drop them off to the designated school contact. Provide your name, email address and phone number to the participating school or youth group contact, and make plans to collect the posters from them for the local judging. Follow local guidelines for gathering and practicing social distancing when holding your contest judging (at the club, district and multiple district levels).

Consider holding your contest judging online.

Photograph the entries and post them without the student's names (remember it is a blind judging) in an online photo gallery such as Flickr, Google Photos, etc. Share the link with your judges and include a score sheet to email back to you. **Recognize local winners** by sharing their poster images with your local news media and by posting them on social media (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, etc.) with #PeacePoster.

How are you adapting and innovating the way you hold your contest? We would love to hear from you.
