Looking back over the year, this country has encountered the most unbelievable challenges, notably the worst unrest we've ever seen with the July riots, one of worst natural disasters on record with the April flooding, and the devastating after-effects of 2 years of lockdown restrictions. Lions rose to meet these challenges head on, rising above the constraints of COVID to truly embody our motto “*We Serve*”.



The response to the recent flooding and resultant devastation in KZN being one such example, with Clubs across our District contributing funds to a blanket drive, collecting food and emergency relief supplies, and acting as collection points for donations. Lions Clubs in KZN immediately jumped in to provide much needed support to hardest hit homes and families. The Acorn Foundation reinstated the Ubuntu flight initiative with CemAir, and together with Seaborne Express transported all the collected supplies down to KZN.

We successfully applied for an emergency grant for US\$10,000 from LCIF, which is being used to purchase emergency relief supplies, which are being distributed via the Lions Clubs in the affected areas to those people in need. 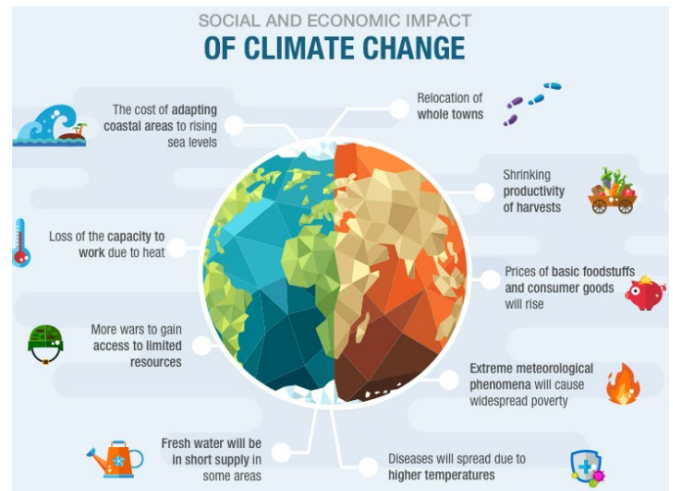

MESSAGE FROM MDC ALERT THE IMPACT OF CLIMATE CHANGE



What is the effect on individuals and animals?

The impact on human health with worsening air and water quality, increasing the spread of certain diseases. Rising sea levels threaten coastal communities and ecosystems. More frequent and intense drought, storms, heat waves, melting glaciers and warming oceans can directly harm animals, destroy their natural habitat, and wreak havoc on human livelihoods and communities. With the exacerbation of climate change, dangerous weather events are becoming more frequent and severe, as recently observed with the KZN flooding.



How can Lions Clubs mitigate Climate Change?

With the increase for humanitarian assistance, this results in our Lions Clubs needing to support local communities with shelter, food, water, blankets, toiletries, etc. It is imperative that Lions Clubs ensure that they play their part in cleaning ups of rivers, tree planting, sustainable vegetable gardens, recycling initiatives, etc.

Look at sustainable projects to assist communities in terms of hunger alleviation, clean environments, purification of water supplies, etc.

Why the need to be knowledgeable on Climate Change:
Climate change affects almost every aspect of our lives, from our food sources to our transport infrastructure, clothing worn, where we may choose to go on holiday. It has a huge impact on our livelihoods, our health, and our future. Climate change is the long-term pattern of weather conditions. Climate change and extreme weather events such as heat waves, floods, fires, air pollutants and droughts have a direct impact on 70% of all economic sectors worldwide.



There is reason for concern:

With the increase in temperatures and subsequent heat waves which both the potential to impact adversely on human health. It can also result in damage to crucial infrastructures such as roads, bridges, water systems, electrical grids, dam levels and many more.

Thanks to the Lions Club of Beacon Bay who timeously sent a write up and photos about their Gonubie Beach Clean-up. Being awarded the coveted blue flag status means a beach meets high environmental and international standards of sustainably. This status does wonders for the local environment and tourism. Each beach is measured according to its performance in the following categories: Environmental Education and Awareness, Water Quality, Environmental Management, and Safety Services. The Lions Club Beacon Bay, East London working in conjunction with the Gonubie Ratepayers Association hosted a beach clean-up on Saturday April 9 at the Gonubie Beach starting at 7:30 featuring "Louis the Lion Fish". Louis has been built by the Lions Club over the past few months and loves to eat beach litter.



R180.00 was budgeted to boost the post to the public living within 40 km of East London who identified in their Facebook profiles that they have an interest in the environment, community issues and volunteering. The response was overwhelming. Over 26000 members of the public saw this advert and over 1800 engaged, meaning they either clicked on the post, read it, commented, or shared it with an engagement rate of approximately 7%.



This level of engagement is usually reserved for international celebrities with a huge social media following, not a Lions Club in South Africa. We hope that this project goes from strength to strength and that the Lions Club of Beacon Bay and *Louis the litter eating Lion Fish* is able to reach the goal of Blue Flag Status for Gonubie Beach.

A FEW OF THE LIONS AWARENESS PROJECTS DONE BY THE CLUBS OF DISTRICT 410E

Lions Club of Pretoria Jakaranda



The Tree Trail in the Pretoria National Botanical Garden is a self-guided route that starts at the Garden entrance and introduces the visitor to 50 of South Africa's beautiful indigenous trees. It is complimented by a descriptive booklet with information and photos of the trees which are clearly marked. This route is easy to follow for young and old and is approximately one kilometre in distance and can be done in less than 2 hours at a leisurely pace.



What makes this route even more special is that it is now accessible for visually impaired visitors. With the generous assistance and sponsorship of the Lions Club of Pretoria Jakaranda, visually impaired visitors can experience this Tree Route with the aid of either large print or Braille booklets containing information about every tree along the route.



The booklets are available at the Main Entrance, on loan against a refundable deposit of R20. Tree labels are also equipped with a Braille number that corresponds to information in the booklet.

On 17 April, members went shopping for food and a 3-plate gas stove that is on load to the Mariannridge Community Hall to enable them to do their own cooking, as well as 2 large pots. Donations were received of nappies and baby clothes from Baby Hope house, blankets for the babies from our knitting project as well as some underwear, mittens etc.

They delivered 100 loaves of bread, margarine, instant coffee and long-life milk to Mariannridge on 26 April where they are feeding approximately 250 people displaced people.

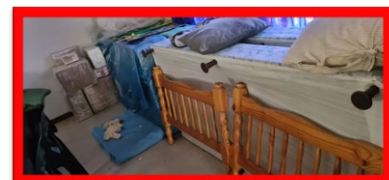

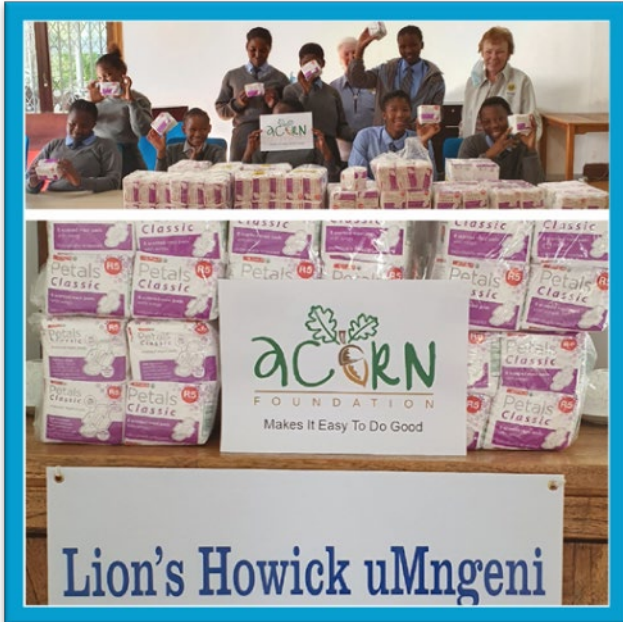

- Are the age of legal majority through the age of 35



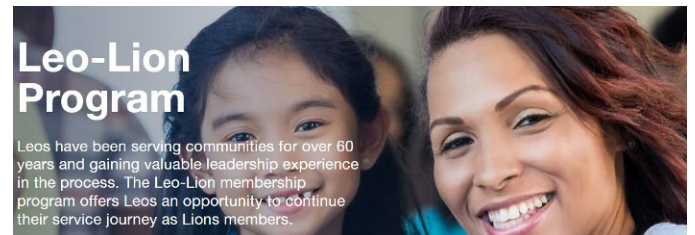

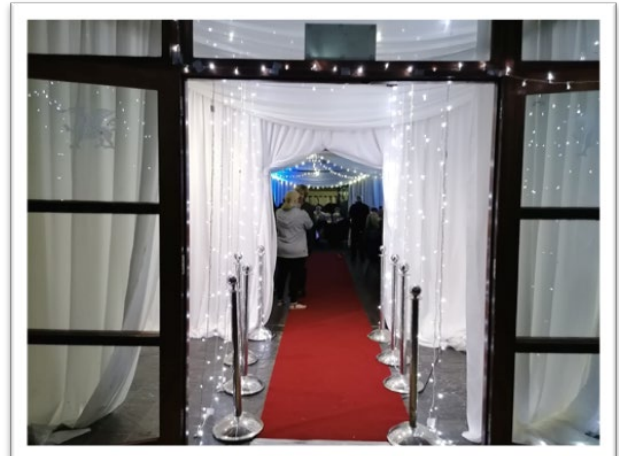

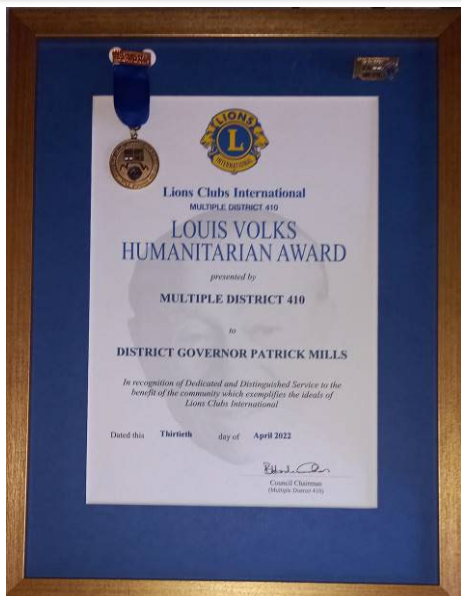
