

MD 410 VISION 2022 AND BEYOND (MDC GLT, PCC Cliff Hocking)



The MD 410 Global Leadership Team proposed to the Council of Governors that a Leadership "Think Tank" be held to workshop where we are in terms of leadership in the Multiple District of 410, where we would like to be and how to get there in order to have an aligned strategy in place for the future of MD 410.



The workshop was held in Gordon's Bay on Friday 19 August 2022 and aligned with the Council Meeting the following day.

The participants were CC Paula Lang; DG's Sydney van Heerden and Charlie Flanagan, GAT Area Leader PCC Herman Smit, MD GLT Coordinator PCC Cliff Hocking, CCE Bernd Gerhard, 1st VDG's Lindie van Wyk and Neville van Rensburg, District GLT Coordinators Delphine Ferreira and Tillie Nel.



The activities of the day were filled by seven hours of intensive discussion, deliberation, debate, and interaction on the flow of training requirements, strategic and long-range planning, leadership programme components and phases, mentoring and succession planning culminating in the impacts of where we need to be in terms of leadership, membership, and service culminating in where to from here?

This "think thank" was conducted in the true spirit of Lionism with courteous disagreements, differing views and opposing opinions but without any hidden agendas, personal missions, and inter-district pettiness. A real pleasure to have witnessed the spirit of cooperation and togetherness!

The following high-level goals were agreed upon for the next three years:



• All Clubs to be at 20 members or more within the next 3 years. This includes the reduction of membership losses in clubs (resignations etc.) to below 50% of what it has been in recent years. Stagnant clubs will therefore be forced to improve or face closure via a "tough love" approach.



 Succession planning to be implemented with all Clubs reflecting at least one Vice President on their 2023-2024 PU101 reporting as a starting point.



 Community based service activities to form the foundation of service, community engagement and marketing activities.

 The integration of mentorship, succession planning and leadership within Club President and Zone Chairmen structures to be managed and driven by Region Chairs and VDG's



 Overall administration (club reporting, administration etc.) and financial management (payments, ethical behaviour, and governance etc.) to receive priority treatment at Club level.



• New member orientation to be structured with emphasis on individual Club history, structures, culture etc.



• Use of technology in Clubs and skilling up of members to use MyLion, MyLCl to become second nature in Clubs.



• Mediocre leadership within District structures will not be tolerated.



The implementation is in the hands of the Districts, using Cabinet Meetings, District / Regional / Zone Forums, and all other available means to continuously promote the concepts of improvement as well as the monitoring thereof.




#### World Sight Day Challenge - 13 October 2022







The Lions Club of East Coast has a longstanding friendship with Sinakekele Children's home in Oakford Priory. Butternut, gem squash, sweet potatoes, diapers, formula, purity, wet wipes, cereal, long life milk and nido powdered milk were purchased and these items were handed over to the Children's Home who were very grateful to have the support of the Lions Club of East Coast.



Vision screening was conducted by the Lions Club of East Coast at Whetstone Primary School in Phoenix. 465 learners were screened over two days from Grades R to 7 all of whom produced signed parental consent forms. 76 were found to have problems with their eyes. 15 had very poor sight. Worryingly, only 6 of them had glasses. An overview was presented to the school's VP after all learners were screened. Written feedback to parents and a summary to the class Educator was left with the school for reference and follow up. The Lions Club of East Coast is on standby to assist indigent or neglected Learners with the provision of spectacles.

In addition to various species of crabs and other wildlife, this nature reserve has the largest number of mangrove trees in Durban and is managed by Ezemvelo KZN Wildlife. Equipped with disposable gloves and bin bags, the team impressed all by collecting more than 93kg of rubbish filled in 22 bags over 3 hours. The unconscionable littering ranged from an assortment of packets, shoes, plastic and glass bottles and caps, metal items, the dreaded polystyrene and much more. Nevertheless, the reward was the end result of the clean-up sound in the knowledge that however small, they contributed to a better sea and land environment.


