And we are supporting the Vaal Mall in a drive for rag and knitted dolls."

The various book sales have thus far sold more than 265 books, and at their regular Blood Drives, 50 pints of blood were collected.








The Lions Club of Cowies Hill entertained the residents at Pinehaven Retirement Home with a Fun Games Evening on the 14th of October.

The Lions Club Centurion Lifestyle has a long-standing relationship with the management team at the Tshwane Municipality owned Bishop Bird Park Wildlife Park in Rooihuiskraal.



A raised wooden deck in the park that was built many years ago was in serious disrepair and needed the old and broken wooden deck replaced with something that was longer lasting and better looking. The City of Tshwane was unable to fund or undertake the necessary repair work that was needed for this raised viewing deck.



Eva-Last (Eva-Last.com) is a composite decking importer and fitment company based in Gauteng and they agreed to assist the Lions Club by repairing and replacing the deck flooring and the supports at no cost. They used the opportunity as a team building exercise for their sales team and after a hard day's work and lots of sweat their support for Lions and Bishop Bird Park and the whole community of birders and walkers that use this amazing wildlife park was clearly evident.

The Eva-Last sales team had removed all the old rotting boards and the supporting beams and replaced them with their own long lasting new composite boards. It is estimated that the cost of the repair work was in the order of about R35 000.00. A sustainable service project which will benefit all who visit the park.





It took a lot of hard work and serious effort for the seasoned team to put together another crazy team game Innit2Winnit event. The previous Innit2Winnit event in 2019 was cancelled due to Covid.



Through contacts with the Carstens' family the organisers put together a 2022 Innit2Winnit event with the proceeds being dedicated to the Lions Club of Centurion Lifestyle for their ongoing community service projects. Initially the event was targeted at raising enough funds for a suitably appropriate wheelchair for a young immobile man referred to the Club by the "Clothes to Good" NGO. This young man in his late teens suffers from autism and muscular dystrophy. The only way he can move around his home is to sit on an upturned plastic pool chemical bucket and push it around with his legs. Certainly not an ideal solution indoors and definitely impossible outdoors.



The Innit2Winnit event was held on the 17^{th} of September with 9 teams of 8 players each. It was wild, it was crazy and it certainly was a whole lot of noisy fun which raised just over R15000.00. All the hard work and preparations really paid off although another 4 or 5 teams would certainly have been a bonus.



Through a Lions contact it was found, just after the fundraising event, that he could possibly obtain a special wheelchair and other assistance from the State in a reasonably short period of time.

An assessment of his special needs was undertaken at Hillbrow Hospital and it seems as though he will be able to receive a special wheelchair. He will also be able to receive additional support for his condition from the medical specialists there. This is an amazing and quite unexpected win-win situation for everyone - especially for the intended recipient of the Innit2Winnit event as he can now get real and more meaningful long-term support from a new-found team of caring and dedicated medical experts.



At the time of writing this article, the Lions Club of Centurion Lifestyle is following up on his assessment progress and with the funds raised from the Innit2Winnit event will be able to assist him in meeting his other material needs if a wheelchair can be obtained through the kind medical team at the Hillbrow Hospital. Overall, there were many quite unexpected positives that came out of the Club's wonderful Innit2Winnit fundraising initiative.



It just goes to show how important partnerships and networking are in order for Lions to uphold their motto of "WE SERVE".


DIABETES AWARENESS MONTH – NOVEMBER 2022

FACT: South Africa has the 2nd Highest incidence of Diabetes in Africa. This is the very reason why Lions need to create AWARENESS around DIABETES and the prevention thereof.


There are TWO TYPES OF DIABETES:



Type 1: Once called insulin-dependent or juvenile diabetes. It usually develops in children, teens, and young adults, but it can happen at any age. Type 1 diabetes is less common than Type 2 - about 5-10% of people with diabetes have Type 1. Currently, no one knows how to prevent type 1 diabetes, but it can be treated successfully by:

- Following your Doctor's recommendations for living a healthy lifestyle.
- Managing your blood sugar.
- Getting regular health check-ups.

Type 2: Also known as Type 2 Diabetes Mellitus, develops when your blood sugar (blood glucose) levels are elevated for an extended period of time. In Type 2 diabetes, your pancreas may not be able to make enough insulin - the hormone that regulates blood glucose - or your body's cells cannot properly use insulin to take in glucose. This is called insulin resistance. As a result, blood sugar levels stay high, eventually leading to symptoms that affect the entire body.





Now that you know what DIABETES is, our service to the community as Lions, is to make the community aware of their status by holding regular glucose testing screenings, encourage people to be active and exercise and make healthy food choices by eating plenty of vegetables, fruit, legumes and whole grains; achieve a healthy body weight & maintain it!

STRIDES FOR DIABETES

Strides events involve fun physical activity to help promote diabetes awareness and management.

TYPE 2 DIABETES SCREENING

Diabetes peer support groups encourage the exchange of support of all types among community members living with diabetes.

WHAT CAN WE, AS LIONS, DO IN PRACTICE to build diabetes awareness:



1. Seek **ASSISTANCE** such as sponsorships for, posters, brochures from Diabetes SA, FOR A, local endocrinologists, pharmaceutical companies. Partnerships with "experts" gives more credibility. Remember we as Lions are not diabetes medical professionsals.



2. Hold **DIABETES SCREENINGS** within your community with the relevant information on hand. Always have a qualified person on site to offer medical advice.



 Hold an EVENT to make your community aware of the fact that Lions support Diabetes Month, ideally on or around the 14th of November – World Diabetes Day.

Ideas for an event could include:A Strides Walk and Wellness Day




- A screening
- A cooking demonstration utilizing correct food, products, recipes and methods of cooking suitable for diatetics.



4. Start a **WEEKLY 2km WALK** within the community that you serve. Similar to Park Runs but more localized.



5. Hold a **DIABETES CAMP** for children. These could take the form of a fun and educational day or a weekend sleepover.
