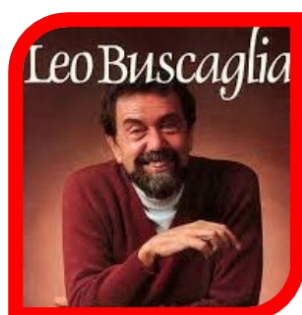

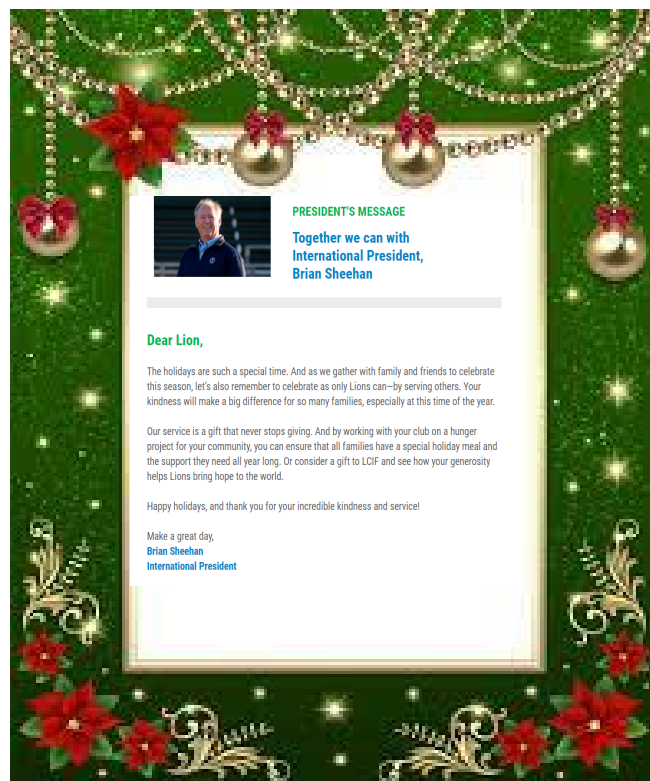

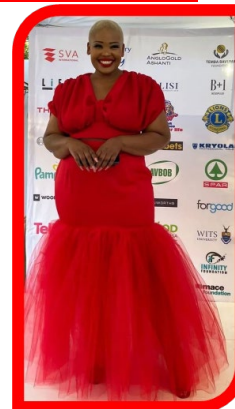
## TUKS Leo Club

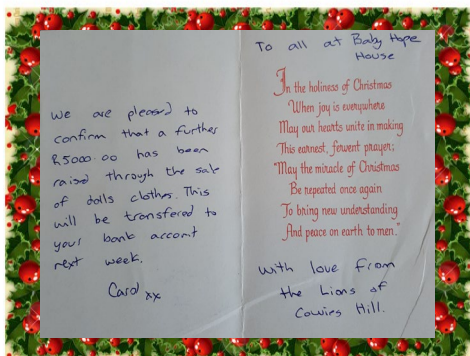
## Lions Club of Cowies Hill

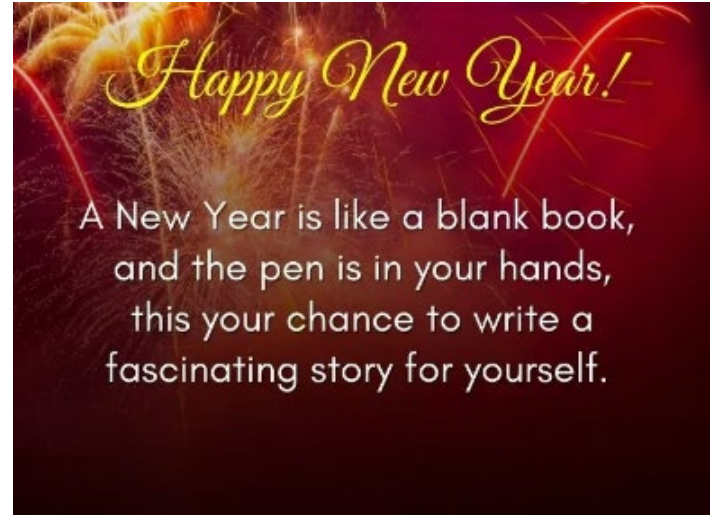
