

February hosts Childhood Cancer Day on 15 February. The ribbon worn to support this day is gold.


Why we as Lions should support this pillar: "Around 300,000 children all around the globe are diagnosed with cancer each year. This adds up to a significant amount in every country per month. Therefore, the need for Childhood Cancer Awareness is still high. Some of the cancer cases that could have been avoided are those that, if diagnosed earlier, would have had a different outcome. This is why a Childhood Cancer Awareness Campaign is ongoing worldwide.




Create Awareness: Hold a FUNdraising Face Painting event at a Shopping Centre; hand out gold ribbons to adults; paint faces and hand out early warning sign brochures.



Educate: At schools and libraries by having colouring pages. Supply printed sheets and crayons and talk to kids so they can be aware if they have kids in their class with cancer. Especially as these kids may be away from school and may lose hair. Many suitable pics available at:

Wheroes Walk: hold a walk where the public pay and walk while wearing a cape. This is to bring awareness to the families, health workers and palliative care staff. Lions can donate monies raised to an organisation of their choice. By doing this you also promote awareness of this organisation.



Bake for CUPCAKES OF HOPE: Hold a tea party or baking sale to raise funds for the families supported by Cupcakes 4 Hope. You can create awareness for Childhood cancer at the same time, and the work Lions are doing.

WHats: collect hats for kids that may lose their hair. Join with local Oncology Departments (both private and state) to reach the kids.

Wheadbands: make heads bands for the same reason. 13 | P a g e Shavathon: Find your local CANSA branch and get on board. It is great fun!



WFulfill a Wish: Keep your eyes on local media or ask in the Oncology Department for any special wish made by a child with cancer that you can fulfill. Ensure you use social media to assist you here as the child is in their community and it gives everyone a chance to support the family.

Bags of Hope: Fill bags with goodies for youngsters in hospital. Please check what is allowed and suitable. This is especially important for children who do not get visitors as they are far from home.

Support Palliative Care Organisations: Research CHOC; PATCHSA; Umduduzi, Butterfly Palliative Care to see what they might need help with. While this may be financial support e.g. food for families when the child goes home; money for transport for family to visit. Visit children in hospital on a regular basis to play with and educate them, especially important for kids missing school.

Family Photo Shoot for the Future: Many families may not have many memories of the child who is ill, and may not have finances to do anything about it. If this young person passes on, no photos is a tragedy. Link up with local photographers to do a mini photoshoot for a family. Get a good photo and get it framed for the family.

Flip Flop Friday: This year is on 17 February. Wear your Flip flops, takes pics and post using the #flipflopday. Post on social media and make a donation to CHOC. Perhaps Club Members can all go out to coffee in their Lions shirts and flip flops, post to show support of CHOC. Get your company to sponsor Flipflopday and make a donation to CHOC. LIONS BRIGHTSIGHT SUCCESSFUL SCHOOL VISION SCREENING PROJECT



This project was launched in 2021, due to the generous donation received from the Lions Club of Harrow and Pinner in the UK with the assistance of the Global Grants Department of Lions Clubs International Foundation.

The goals set for this project were:

To provide vision screening and refraction services to an estimated 3,350 underprivileged children for early identification and intervention, for sight problems, in selected schools in the Tshwane District of the Gauteng Province.

To treat learners minor eye ailments in the early stages and to dispense spectacles to those in need.

To refer those learners with other eye conditions for further medical treatment.

To monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the project.

Lions BrightSight is pleased to announce that the goals of this much needed project were exceeded.
