Attended the Induction of LPE Yolandi at Midrand Lions Club on Sunday.



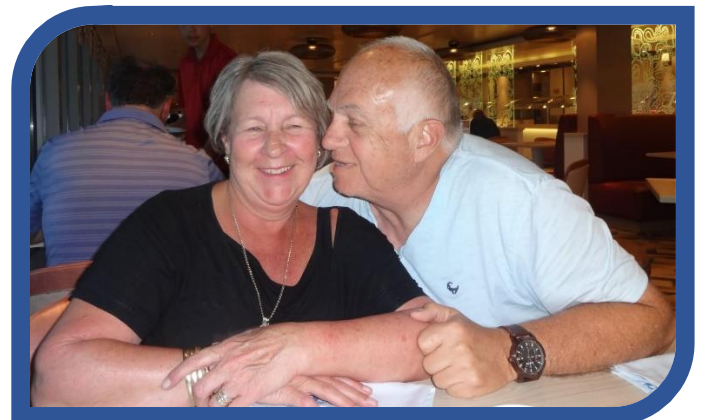

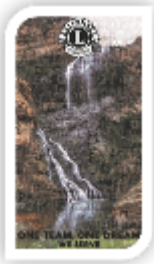

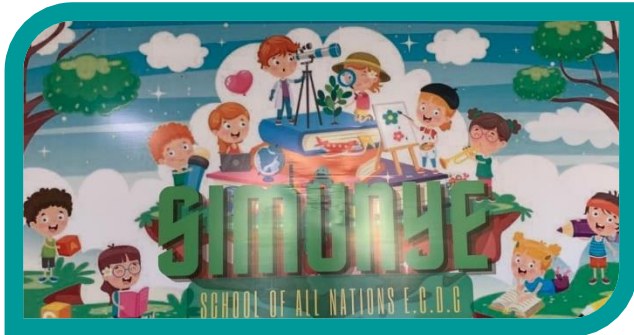

Lions Club of Port Alfred

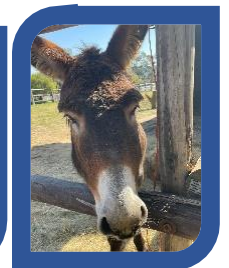

On Saturday, the 17th of June, members of the Lions Club of Manzini visited Malindza Refugee Reception Centre, where they donated secondhand clothing, which had been collected from the Lions, friends and from the public at various fundraisers.



On this visit they were accompanied by Lions Ray and Ann Staniland, visiting from the Lions Club of Sandwell in the UK. The lady in charge of the refugee centre, Bongekile, advised that this is not a refugee camp, but a reception centre for refugees. Once refugees are processed, they are allowed to leave the centre. But many stay. There are currently approximately 2000 refugees in the country and about 500 reside at the centre. These are refugees from all over Africa, escaping troubles in their own countries, from as far as Somalia and Ethiopia.

She further explained that many have fled, sent by their parents, to avoid recruitment by El Shabab, who would otherwise kill the youngsters who refuse to join. The centre has a kitchen, which feeds unaccompanied children, the elderly and disabled, and new arrivals. Otherwise, the refugees are expected to cook for themselves.



The Lions were shown around the centre, which is large, but somewhat overcrowded. UNHCR (United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees) had been supporting the centre, however more recently, all their resources have been directed to the Ukrainian conflict, where so many refugees are fleeing. This means that the Government of Eswatini are expected to now take over the expenses. Unfortunately, their contribution is not sufficient. Primary education in Eswatini is free, but the Government have refused to pay for the education of the primary age refugees, as they are not Swazi.

Whilst the contribution from Lions seemed insignificant compared to their needs, the centre were grateful for the donations from the Lions and will hand out clothing to refugees a few at a time, to ensure it all goes to those who need it most.

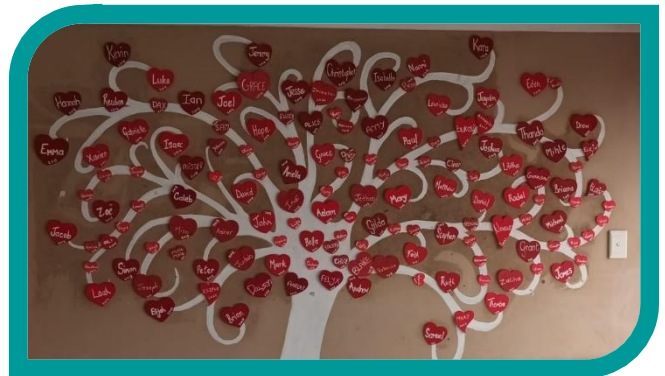

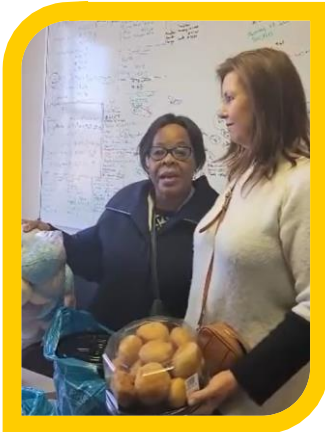
