Thank you to those Clubs who send me their minutes where I can see that membership is on the agenda and seriously being addressed and considered to ensure that we can sustain the impactful community service that we do. Club Presidents were asked to replace all Lions who leave their Clubs as a bare minimum and to strengthen Club Members and inter-zone relationships.



Our District is currently standing at a net growth of -5. We inducted 44 new Lions, but sadly lost 49.

CLARITY RE: LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL VS LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION

Lions Clubs International (LCI) and the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) are two interconnected organizations that work together to serve communities and address various needs around the world. Together they form Lions International. While they share common goals, they have slightly different areas of focus and ways of operation.

Here's an explanation of the difference between Lions Clubs International's global causes and the focus areas of the Lions Clubs International Foundation ...

Lions Clubs International Global Causes

Lions Clubs International focuses on five global service areas, often referred to as "Global Causes." These areas are chosen because they encompass significant humanitarian challenges that Lions members work to address. The five global causes are:



Vision: This cause involves projects that aim to prevent blindness, restore sight, and improve eye care services. Lions are known for their commitment to providing eyeglasses, conducting vision screenings, and supporting eye health initiatives.

Hunger: Lions work to alleviate hunger and promote food security through various initiatives such as food banks, community gardens, and assistance programs for those in need.

Environment: Lions engage in projects that support environmental sustainability and promote a deaner and healthier planet. This can include tree planting, waste reduction, and other eco-friendly initiatives.

Disaster Relief: LCIF provides aid during natural disasters and emergencies, offering immediate relief and assisting with long-term recovery efforts.




Humanitarian Needs: LCIF addresses broader humanitarian needs, such as providing access to dean water, supporting education, and improving healthcare infrastructure.


Youth Empowerment: LCIF invests in programs that empower young people through education, leadership development, and mentorship opportunities.

Start with these simple changes to reduce digital eye strain:



Bat your eyes at me! Train yourself to blink more often. Every blink you make spreads fresh tears across the surface of your eyes, cleaning and refreshing! Use lubricating eyedrops if necessary.



Make me more comfortable! Adjust screen settings like brightness, contrast, colour temperature and text size.



Don't glare at me! Use proper lighting and position your computer screen to avoid glare. Try antiglare screens or screen protectors to avoid discomfort.




juries in the workplace. Caused by staring at a computer monitor for too long, CVS can cause headaches, blurred vision and dry or watery eyes.



By now we all know that **October is Vision Awareness Month** and I urge all Clubs to plan and implement sight related projects - helping the visually impaired in any way you can.



World Sight Day is Thursday 12 October



White Cane Day is Sunday 15 October

- Get involved in a Blind Bowlers event.
- Find out about arranging a Blind Navigators' Rally.
- Contact a local society for the visually impaired to see how your Club can assist them.
- Sponsor a Guide Dog, contact the SA Guide Dog Association to find out how you can help.
- Arrange eye screening at a local school, community centre or old age home.
- Contact some ophthalmologists to see if they would do pro bono consultations for State pensioners suffering with cataracts – there is such a need out there!
- Sponsor a World Sight Day event.
- Host a fundraiser to purchase and donate white canes for those who are blind.
- Develop a discount voucher program with optometrists for the underprivileged.
- Design a transportation program for those who are blind or have low vision.
- Create a sensory garden that engages the senses of touch, smell, hearing & taste. Provide braille or audio recordings of signage.
- Partner with and support a school for the blind.

HUNGER ALLEVIATION DAY 16 OCTOBER 2023 (DC GST, Lion Sandy King)



While our focus is on Vision Awareness Month, I'd like to bring to your attention the following statistics about **hunger in our country**:

According to data from Stats SA for January 2023, food inflation has hit a 14-year high at 13.4%, while a study from the University of Witwatersrand's School of Physiology determined that 1 in 5 South African households **don't have enough food to eat**.

Over 20.6% of the South Africans in the sample were socially vulnerable, and 20.4% food insecure. This amounts to about 7.8 million people out of their sample of 39.6 million people. But the prevalence varied widely across the provinces. The Eastern Cape Province was the most affected (32% of households there were food insecure).

Irene Labuschagne, principal dietitian at the Nutrition Information Centre at Stellenbosch University, wrote that "one in 10 South Africans go hungry every day".



Malnutrition is not only stunting, but it can also lead to people being overweight and obese. Malnutrition continues to be a problem in the Republic of South Africa, 15% of infants are born with a low birth weight. 7 | P a g e



This is scary and very concerning. No-one should have to go to bed feeling hungry, especially our children!

Here are some ways we as Lions can help alleviate hunger in our country:

- Organise a programme at a local school to provide healthy, nutritious meals.
 - Prepare food baskets for families in need.

Organise a food packing day and partner with a social workers group (eg. Tutela) to provide food parcels to needy families.


- Volunteer at a soup kitchen or homeless shelter.
- Organise an event to benefit a food bank in your community; use cans of food for admission.
- Hold a hunger walk and use the proceeds to buy food for a children's centre or a homeless shelter.
- Create healthy snack packages to be distributed to children in need.
- Partner with local restaurants or food markets to deliver donations to a shelter.
- Collect infant formula and baby food for an organization serving young mothers at risk.
- Provide fruits and vegetables as a healthy snack for children in childcare facilities.
- Teach children to bake a loaf of bread they can take home to their family.
 - Provide needy children with backpacks supplied with food for when school is not in session.

Establish a community vegetable garden where residents can grow their own food.




The same at District level, and your Global Leadership Team leader is 2nd VDG Avril.

LIONS 101 Monday 16 October 2023 at 19:00 Save the Date and the Zoom link will follow.





Kwanele from the Daveyton Association for the Disabled collected the chest freezer on 2 September 2023.



Lions Club of Kingsburgh






The Club were delighted to hand over the September food collection to the amazing people doing so much good work in the community (Wanderers Haven) on 11 September.







The Monthly Eye Clinic and Diabetes Screening took place on Saturday 30 September with the Vision Team at the Lions Club of Midrand Community Centre.




