As the world reaches the end of the calendar year 2023, Lions all over the world are entering the second half of our Lionistic year in January 2024. This means that we still have another six months to achieve the goals we've set ourselves as Lions this year.



I would like to thank each Lion for giving your free time to serve our community and for the amazing work you do. So far this year, we, Lions of District 410E, have served over 258,000 people together. I'm proud when I look at the priorities we have. There are many hungry people in our country, and because of us, over 94,000 people were helped in 401 service activities. We did 128 environmental projects and assisted over 7,700 people with 174 vision related projects.

Please see how well some of our Clubs are performing focusing on our service pillars:



Diabetes - Midrand served 3,034 people.

Environment – Centurion Lifestyle has completed 19 environmental related projects with a goal of planting 1,000 trees.

Childhood Cancer – Cowies Hill Lions having completed 19 Childhood cancer projects volunteering 179 hours and Alberton Lions serving 193 hours during 42 projects. Hunger Relief – Cowies Hill served over 20,500 people, Alberton completed 62 hunger relief projects in over 1,500 volunteer hours



Vision – Alberton served over 1,500 people and Vereeniging over 1,450 people in vision projects with Letaba Tzaneen volunteering 437 hours to vision related projects.

FOUNDATION Thanks to all Lions and Clubs who have donated so generously to LCIF and specifically Pretoria South who donated R30,000 and Manzini Lions who donated R12,000.



As we look back at these great achievements, we should all feel extremely proud to be Lions and to be able to serve our community in such a positive way.








SUMMER SAFETY FOR YOUR EYES




With summer comes fun outdoors and cooling off with a swim, but also exposure to the harmful rays of the sun and the risks present in water. Our eyes are also vulnerable to the invisible dangers...

While tanning beds and activities such as welding produce UV light, the biggest UV threat to the eyes is the sun. Our eyes are also vulnerable to the invisible dangers in the ocean, lakes, rivers, and even chlorinated swimming pools.



There are three types of ultraviolet radiation from the sun, UVA, UVB and UVC. The appropriate amount of ultraviolet radiation benefits us by facilitating the processing of vitamin D in the body, producing serotonin and aiding bone development. Overexposure to ultraviolet rays can be harmful to the body and particularly the eyes. UVC radiation is considered a minimal threat because it is absorbed by the earth's ozone layer. Exposure to UVA and UVB rays poses a risk for both short-term and long-term damage to the eyes and vision. Short-term exposure to ultraviolet radiation can cause damage in the eyes that is similar to a sunburn. The eyes become red and puffy, feel gritty, are sensitive to light and there is excessive tearing. Fortunately, these symptoms are usually temporary. However, damage from UV radiation is cumulative over a person's lifetime and if the eyes are exposed to longterm UV radiation without adequate protection, there may be a greater risk of developing cataracts and/or macular degeneration later in life.

NOT ALL SUNGLASSES ARE CREATED EQUAL



With so many options available, it is difficult to know which sunglasses offer the best protection. Most reputable brands of sunglasses list the amount of UV protection on the label, which should say "100% protection against UVA and UVB" or "100% UV400 protection". No label generally means no protection! It is understandable to think that the darker the lenses are, the more effective the protection, but this may not necessarily be true. They may block visible light but do not automatically block UV radiation. Unless it is specifically indicated, dark lenses may not offer better protection. While filtering out ambient light and glare, very dark lenses may cause the pupils to open to allow more light to enter the eyes, increasing rather than reducing UV light exposure. The lenses should be dark enough to keep the eyes comfortable, but not so dark that they reduce vision.

BE WATER WISE

Bodies of water, from lakes and rivers to sparkling swimming pools, are contaminated to a greater or lesser extent with bacteria and organisms that can affect the eyes. Whether simply cooling off, diving underwater or being sprayed with water while waterskiing, the eyes are at risk. Bacteria in water can cause an infection of the cornea, which can be painful and become serious if not treated. The chemicals in swimming pools can irritate the protective tear film of the eyes, leading to redness and light sensitivity, but the discomfort is typically temporary.



As a general precaution against contamination and irritation of the eyes, wear water-tight goggles that prevent water from getting into the eyes. After getting out of the water gently wipe water from the eyes with a clean towel. Use lubricating eye drops to moisturise the eyes, and drink water to retain hydration which is of benefit to the entire system as well as the eyes.

SWIMMING WITH CONTACT LENSES



It has been recommended that contact lenses are not exposed to any water, including tap water, swimming pools, lakes, oceans, showers and even saunas, no matter if it is fresh water or chlorinated. Contact lenses should be removed before engaging in any water activities to avoid the high risk of irritation or infection from bacteria or viruses that can lodge between the contact lens and the eye. Exposure of soft contact lenses to water can cause them to tighten against the eye. Added to that, soft contact lenses are porous, allowing chemicals and bacteria to enter the eyes. If it is not possible to swim without contact lenses, wear well-fitting goggles while swimming, remove the contact lenses immediately afterwards and soak them in a contact lens solution.



Allowing the lenses to be completely disinfected eliminates the risk of exposing your eyes to bacteria that could have been absorbed into the lenses.







STAY SAFE DURING THE HOLIDAYS (YOU AND YOUR HOME)

With many of us travelling to see family or loved ones, and being out and about, the December holidays are also unfortunately prime season for various criminals, like burglars, porch pirates, and scammers.

December is crunch-time for opportunistic thieves and home invaders. Remember, these thieves will actively seek out the "low-hanging fruit" of residences where they can identify breaches, or weak points. Be proactive about your home security and don't let yourself be an easy target.



Background checks. Firstly, make sure that anyone who works for you, or on your property, or a house sitter if you are going away, is someone you know and trust. Don't just hire someone new without a background check.



Vigilance is key. Talk to your family, as well as your staff who work at your residence about the importance of keeping doors and gates locked, and what do to in case of a security emergency. Remind them to always keep a lookout, and don't just trust the word of any strangers who arrive at your gate, as they could be thieves, scammers, or con artists.



Work together with your community. Make friends with your neighbours and join your area's WhatsApp neighbourhood security groups.



Do the necessary home maintenance work. Keep your property secure and invest in your outdoor security systems if you need to. Start with the basics, such as replacing all outside lights or bulbs that might be faulty, to keep your home and garden areas well-lit at night. Then, secure your perimeters. Double-check your windows and doors, and make sure your garage area is properly secured.



Porch Piracy. A chain is only as strong as its weakest link. Systematically check all areas of your fences and security gates, to ensure a secure perimeter with no weak spots. Also be wary of porch-piracy; a new kind of crime where thieves impersonate you, only to steal goods and gifts delivered to your house by online shops and e-hailing delivery services. If you're expecting parcels, get in touch with the courier or online store, and make a note for the drivers to make sure you sign the receipt for your delivery, and call ahead of time to ensure you're home at the time of delivery.

Out and About. If you're attending a street carnival, public celebration, festival, or going to any busy urban areas, remember to keep your people together and be on the lookout for pickpockets. Keep your valuables in the car if possible, and always remember to lock it!



Road Travel. With the busy festive season period on our doorstep, thousands of families will be travelling by road to their holiday destinations. We recommend they make risk mitigation part of their process of planning for their travels, and this should include testing the vehicle tracking system that they have installed. Combine this testing with any routine maintenance you are doing on your vehicle so that you can pick up any problems now and have it fixed before you hit the road.



Outdoor Activities. Summer is a beautiful time to relish the numerous outdoor activities. We urge you to prioritise safety. This is especially important if you are venturing out alone or are a visitor to South Africa. Personal safety is a shared responsibility between the police, private security and other stakeholders and each individual member of the public. It's wonderful to explore new places and see things through different eyes but be aware that venturing into the unfamiliar does make you vulnerable to getting lost or perhaps making a bad judgement call. Try to always be with a group and keep vigilant.

Vegetable seedlings delivered to the nursery school in the South on 16 November.




16 November - 11 people at Community Hours in Bedfordview had their eyes screened by Alberton Lions. Thank you, Lion Sandy and your team, for your service this morning
