


2. Leadership Toolkit Training

Lions Quest has been implemented in more than 110 countries.




US\$140 million in disaster relief.

World Wildlife Day 2025

Every year the celebration of <mark>World Wildlife Day takes place on the 3rd of March.</mark> The theme for 2025 is Wildlife Conservation Finance: Investing in People and the Planet.







In November 2024 it was mentioned in Geneva "that from the highland steppe to the coral reefs, wild animals and plants hold intrinsic value. As essential parts of earth's intricate web of life, they sustain ecosystems, regulate natural processes, and support biodiversity"

Earth hour is celebrated annually on the 22nd of March, from 20h30 to 21h30.




What happens during Earth hour?

.....for this year's Big Walk for Little Warriors ? International Childhood Cancer Awareness Day is on Saturday 15 February this year and hopefully most of the Clubs have their planning for the Big Walk for Little Warriors well underway.





Last year in the Multiple District we had 25 events, with 62 Clubs participating and more than R126,000.00 was donated to various Childhood Cancer organizations. Our District had 32 Clubs involved in the Big Walk for Little Warriors. Let's try and better that this year. Walks can be casual strolls for a social, a walk along the beach, in a local nature reserve, a street parade – be creative! Please first find out if any permission is required from the local Council for what you are planning.



It's an excellent opportunity to connect with people from our communities and tell them about Lions, and what we do. The objective of the Walk is Childhood Cancer Awareness. Please remember that Childhood Cancer Can Be Cured!



If we can get the message out there for parents to look out for early warning signs and seek professional help, there is a very good chance that the child will be cured. There are flyers indicating Early Warning Signs available which can be printed and handed out on the day.



A summary of planning steps, as per FVDG Avril's writeup:

- 1. Save the Date.
- 2. Which Clubs will participate? Zone?
- 3. Secure a venue pay/obtain permission from municipality if a public space.
- 4. Decide on length of walk.
- 5. Decide on start time early if possible so that it's not too hot. Length of walk approximately 2-4 hours.
- 6. Choose and invite partner/beneficiary see list at the end of this write-up.
- 7. Decide on a participation cost, if at all. Make sure your costs are covered, e.g. goody bags, certificates etc.

Remember:

Display our brand out there: gazebos, posters, Lions waistcoats/T-shirts.

- Same for any partners.
 - Have Start/Finish lines well demarcated.
 - Paramedic or ambulance team in case of emergencies.
 - Maps of route or arrows along the way.
 - Cones or tape to demarcate route.
 - Watering table/s along route and at finish line.

Water bottles, although participants should be encouraged to bring their own in the interest of the environment.



Lions to man a registration table.



Marshalls along the route.



Tail-walkers to ensure everyone finishes safely.

Refreshments if permitted at venue: vendors e.g. cooldrinks, fruit, coffee, street food (burgers, pancakes, boerie rolls).



Suggest participants bring a picnic if the venue is suitable.

O§ Entertainment for duration of walk or after while everyone finishes. Adds to the vibe e.g. DJ or Zumba class or similar.

Lions Grace and Christle were seen delivering groceries again on 21st January.

On 30 November, the Alberton Lions hosted a food collection which included food for our furry friends which was donated to the SPCA. The "human" food was donated to a feeding scheme in the community of Alberton. The food collection was done in conjunction with a Diabetes Screening.



Lion President Mukesh and Lion Melinda (Service Chairperson) assisted at the Toy Run sorting out a lot of food. Dry food was delivered to the creches and feeding schemes that the Club supports.



On 4 December, Grace Trinity Girls School donated 268 Christmas Gifts to the Alberton Lions Club which were distributed to the various children at the Clubs beneficiaries. What a blessing for the children who received their gifts with huge smiles and felt loved at this special time of year.

LIONS CLUB OF HELDERKRUIN




LIONS CLUB OF PORT ALFRED

On 14 December, the Lions Club of Scottburgh were at the local shopping centre selling books as a fundraiser for their diabetes projects.


