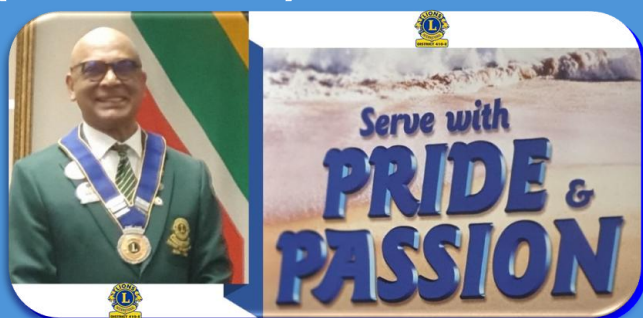

During 2024-2025, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) has focused on several key areas. They awarded over 1,500 grants totaling US\$46.4 million to support various projects globally, and they have exceeded fundraising goals, with a worldwide increase of 108% compared to the target. They also continued to focus on their five pillars of service: Vision, Hunger, Diabetes, Childhood Cancer, and Environment, with 130,000 activities focused on environmental protection, 144,000 on vision, and 269,000 on hunger alleviation.

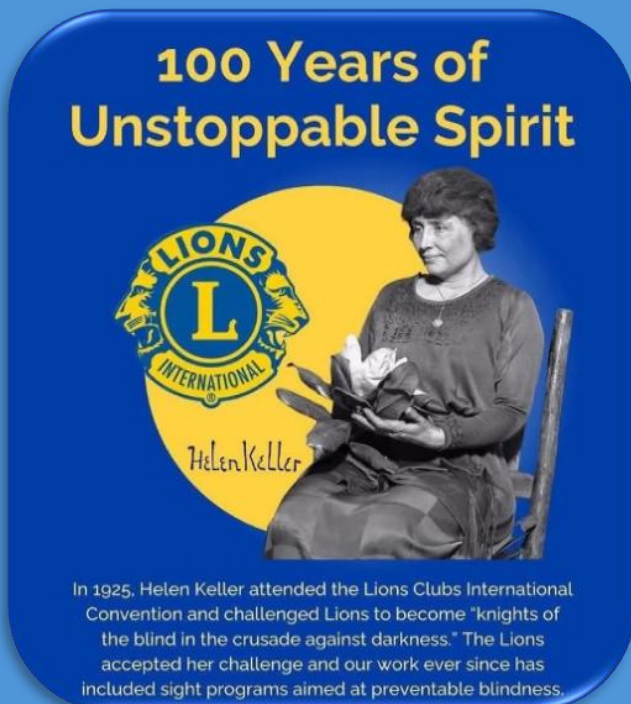

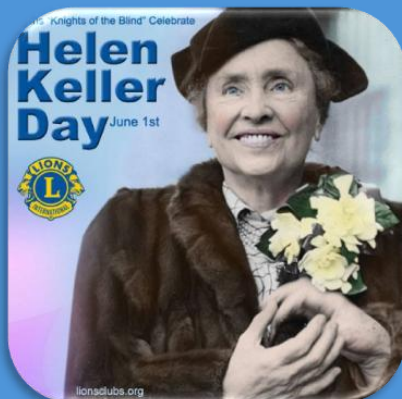

Raising Awareness:

The week aims to educate the public about diabetes, its symptoms, risk factors, and the importance of early diagnosis and management.

Focus on Prevention:

It emphasises the role of healthy lifestyles, including regular exercise, a balanced diet, and weight management, in preventing type 2 diabetes.

Support for Individuals with Diabetes:

The week also provides resources and support for people living with diabetes, including information on managing the condition, accessing treatment, and finding support groups.

Global Participation:

It involves various stakeholders, including governments, healthcare professionals, researchers, and individuals with diabetes, who collaborate to raise awareness and promote diabetes prevention and management.

Blue Lighting and "Wear Blue" Campaigns:

Many countries, including South Africa, participate in blue lighting and "Wear Blue" campaigns during Diabetes Awareness Week to show solidarity with those affected by diabetes.



HOW CAN LIONS GET INVOLVED?

There are plenty of amazing ways to get involved this Diabetes Awareness Week.



Here are a few ideas you could try:



Organise a fundraiser – help raise money towards diabetes research.



Share your story – this week is a good opportunity to share your experience with others.



Teach children about diabetes: By teaching your children or pupils about diabetes, you can help to dispel myths and build understanding. Invite a role model with diabetes to a local school to talk about healthy lifestyle choices.



Organise a Zone/Club Diabetes Camp or sponsor a child to attend a diabetes camp and/or supply a camp with needed supplies.



Post monthly notices on your club or district website and social media accounts, sharing available community resources for people with or at risk of diabetes.



Write about healthy lifestyle choices in your community or school newspaper.



Organise a Strides: Lions for Diabetes Awareness event in your community.



Develop a list of patient resources and services and distribute them to Lions and the public.



Partner with healthcare professionals to organise a screening for diabetes, diabetic retinopathy and diabetic foot.



Promote diabetes prevention through social media campaigns or radio announcements.

Volunteer for a day at a diabetes camp.



Sponsor a healthy cooking demonstration for people with diabetes and pre-diabetes.



Organise a weekly walking club at your place of work and share a healthy snack afterwards.



Bring fresh fruits or vegetables to a primary school classroom to encourage children to try a variety of healthy foods.



Collaborate with a healthcare professional to organise a physical activity and promote exercise.



Organise a community support group for people diagnosed with diabetes and their families.



Work with a healthcare professional to organise a mentorship program, pairing a younger person with diabetes with an older mentor.



Organise a school or community vegetable garden to encourage healthy eating.



Establish a fitness room or ongoing fitness classes at a community centre or school.



Sponsor a training programme for community healthcare workers to learn about screening, community support programs and prevention of diabetes complications.

DISTRICT 410 E GUIDELINES ON MEDICAL SCREENING

These guidelines apply to all forms of public medical screening conducted by any Lions Club or Lions members in the District.

Please note that **ONLY MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS** who are currently registered with a professional medical body or association are permitted to conduct any medical screening.

This includes invasive testing, such as testing of blood glucose levels (diabetes screening through finger pricking) as well as non-invasive testing such as blood pressure monitoring and oxygen level testing.

When non-medical people use an eye screening machine, they must have been trained on how to read the recommendations - ie refer patients for a full test by a professional if necessary. However, they may not diagnose any problem or prescribe any glasses (including readers - they can put them in a box and let the patient choose what works for them). They may not perform any tasks that require formal health-care qualifications. When Lions members (non-medical practitioners) use the eye screening machine, it should be referred to as pre-screening.

Registered Medical Practitioners are licensed to perform screening, diagnose and manage any conditions as well as properly attend to and manage any incidents that may occur should something go wrong while a member of the public is undergoing screening or as a result thereof, e.g. septic finger after pricking.

Furthermore, these Medical Practitioners, by virtue of being registered and licensed, also have the required medical liability insurance in place should any incident occur, protecting themselves and by extension, the relevant Lions Club against any liability.

For clarity, Medical Practitioners include:

- Medical Doctors registered with the Health Professions Council of South Africa
- Nurses registered with the South African Nursing Council or enrolled nurses operating under supervision
- Pharmacists registered with the South African Pharmacy Council
- Community Health Workers who are registered to operate under Department of Health Programmes or Primary Health Care Clinics.

Should a Club or Club Member choose to ignore these guidelines, the Club or individual will be liable for any consequential damage in their personal capacity and not under the banner of Lions.

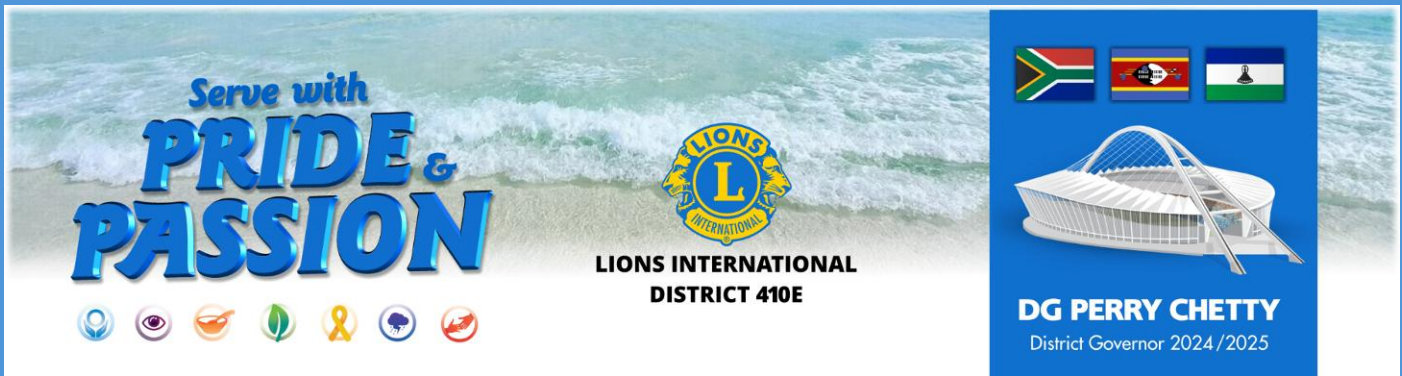
