

DISTRICT 4th 410E CABINET MEETING 1 MAY 2025



WELCOME EVENING 1 MAY 2025





This will definitely *not* be the case at the 2026 MD410 Convention — be afraid, DGE Avril and DGE Bevil... be *very* afraid!




DISTRICT 410E CONVENTION 2 MAY 2025






A very special moment, when DGE Avril received her green blazer from PIP Joe Preston. Suddenly all was a reality!







MD410 CONVENTION BANQUET 2 MAY 2025









The final day of the MD410 Convention was filled with laughter, camaraderie, and the serious business of voting and decision-making by the members — the valued shareholders of the Multiple District.




