### **WRAP UP OF 2024-2025**



Our emblem shows two Lions heads, one looking backwards and one looking forwards. The Lions head looking backwards denotes the past, that is history, and whilst we learn valuable lessons from our past, our focus now needs to be on the Lions head looking forward, which denotes the future of this Lions Club within District 410E.

Let's reflect on the past fiscal year.

### **Global Membership Team (GMT)**

As of 21 June 2025, our District stands at **862 members**, which falls short of the 971 required to be on track for our Strengthen 410E goal of **1,250 members by June 2027**. This shortfall reflects ongoing challenges in both retaining existing members and recruiting new ones.

But there's encouraging news too: for the first time in three years, we've seen a net increase in membership. Engagement in the Club Membership Chair Forum has grown, and more clubs now understand the pivotal role our members play in enabling meaningful service. Simply put, the more hands we have, the greater our impact—in our service, in our membership, and in our leadership.





The Global Membership Team (GMT) has been instrumental in this progress. By equipping clubs with practical tools and resources—and facilitating the well-attended Chair Forum—the GMT has created a platform so successful that it's now open to District 410W membership chairs as well. This spirit of collaboration is key as we move forward with the shared aim of making Lions Clubs the **first choice in service**.

I extend heartfelt thanks to the incredible Lions who make up the GMT: RC Karl Bands, RC Theo Nel, SVDGE Patrick Gamedze, RC Sanet Emerick, RC Vanessa Richardson, PDG Jeff Smith, LP Gopika Dass, Lion Kieth Thompson, Lion Johan Els, and, of course, my evercommitted partner in crime, PDG Ian King. The progress we've made would not have been possible without their tireless efforts, dedication, and passion.

Clubs themselves deserve recognition too—for prioritising member engagement and satisfaction. Knowing your members, understanding their needs, and fostering a positive club environment leads to retention and growth. Happy members stay—and they bring others with them. Let's stay the course and break the annual membership loss trend that often peaks in June.

### By the Numbers (as of 21 June 2025):

- Total Membership: 862
- Members Added (FY): 186
- Members Dropped (FY): 149
- Net Growth: 37
- Net Growth Percentage: 4.29%




### **Global Extension Team (GET)**

The Global Extension Team has worked hard this year in trying to achieve the goals set at the beginning of the year. Although we missed the target of inducting 128 New members by 18 (110 new members inducted), we did manage to charter 2 new clubs as per the original goal albeit a bit fortuitous, but we will take it any which way it happens. However, when one considers that we closed 3 clubs and ended up on 862 members as opposed to a net number of 971, not the ideal result we were looking for.



Having said that, we end the year on a very positive note compared to the past few years and we will continue the impetus going into the new year to continue building 410E. We have 2 new clubs that will be chartered in the new year namely Ruimsig and Cradock and we have a number of very strong potentials in Jeffreys Bay and Graaf Reinet. There are also a number of clubs that have begun showing excellent signs of growing their own numbers with the number of new prospective Lions being inducted in June and July.



The most exciting deal to come out of this year was the formation of the Membership Chair Forum implemented by PDG Alistair. It has worked extremely well, and I trust will be carried on into the new year. The cross pollination of ideas was fantastic and now that it has been extended to District 410W, even better chance of sharing ideas and putting into practice what was discussed. I also believe we dispelled the negativity, to a large extent, around Mission 1,5 in the sense that it was not just a numbers game for the sake of just growing the organisation but, in essence, to be in a position to SERVE more effectively.






### **Global Service Team (GST)**

(DC GST, Lion Sandy King)



Our District has done some amazing service this year and I'm so proud of all the Clubs – Thank you! At the time of writing this article, we have served **514,711** people with **4,359** service activities. More than half a million people's lives were touched by Lions in District 410E!

The wonderful projects done by the individual Lions Clubs are too many to mention, but looking at the chart below, we can see that all our Service Pillars were well supported.







### **DISTRICT PROJECTS**

### **Amazon School Bags**





We received a very generous donation of 1,890 school bags containing stationery and shoes which were sponsored by Amazon. These were handed out to the clubs in the District, and they were donated to local schools in the various areas, some special needs schools, some settlement schools and also those in rural areas. They were all very grateful for the donations.

### **Amazon Childhood Cancer Care Bags**

The 864 Childhood Cancer Care bags sponsored by Amazon were also shared amongst the clubs which responded, requesting bags. Region E in the Eastern Cape delivered theirs to the Oncology Department at the local Provincial Hospital. In the Gauteng area, bags were delivered to children suffering with cancer at Nicus Lodge, CHOC House Soweto, Baragwanath Children's Oncology ward, local Hospices and in Eswatini, they were handed out to children with cancer during the Manzini Club's Big Walk for Little Warriors.

### **Diabetes Awareness - November**



DG Perry requested that we undertake Diabetes projects throughout the District during November. Many clubs heeded the call, especially around World Diabetes Awareness Day.



### **Big Walk for Little Warriors**



Undoubtedly our most successful MD410 project: the annual Childhood Cancer Big Walk for Little Warriors took place in February with most clubs' events being on the 15<sup>th</sup>, Childhood Cancer Day. There were a variety of events: walks in the park, through the suburbs, along the beach, at schools etc. Some were mainly awareness events. Beneficiaries included CHOC, Kids Kicking Cancer, Nicus Lodge, Rainbows and Smiles, CANSA, as well as local Hospices.

Clubs were encouraged to plan various environment clean-ups for World Environment Day around 5 June.

### Service Chairpersons Forum



A Club Service Chairperson Forum has been created, including a WhatsApp Group, like the Marketing Chairperson Forum which has been very successful. The aim is to share ideas and solve any problems which may arise, as well as to help with the reporting of service activities on the Lions Portal. If there are any Clubs which are not represented on the Forum Group, please contact me or PDG Alistair to have you added.



To date, **95%** of Lions Clubs have reported their service activities on the Lions Portal since July. We are aiming to be closer to the 100% mark by the end of June.

It is good to see that clubs are using these funds and recognising members for their dedication and service. Well done to all clubs that have applied.



It is important to remember that LCIF Grants are not only there to fund Disaster Relief efforts but also to fund projects at a much higher scale than clubs can generally afford. ### **LIONS CHRISTMAS CAKES**

Can you believe it's already time for Clubs to place their orders for our **awesome Lions Christmas Cakes**? Where does the time go? Let's spread the festive spirit early and make this another successful (and delicious!) fundraiser.

The baker has indicated his cost price will increase by only 6% for the 2025/26 project. The baker has achieved a remarkable service to the clubs with such a small increase – given inflation and the economic climate the increase could easily have been twice as much or more.

The total cost per cake is broken down as the below:

Bakers Charge per cake (inclusive of R5.00 rebate)	R123,76
MD Levy	R 0,50
District Levy	R 1,00
Lion BrightSight Levy	R 1,00
LI License	R 5,72
TOTAL	R131.98

THE RECOMMENDED SELLING PRICE IS R175.00, which represents a 2.9% increase in the selling price of R170 from 2024/25. The recommended selling price of R175/cake gives a profit of R43.02 per cake, which increases to R48.02 if the rebate is qualified for – payment within 35 days from date of invoice – the payment must reflect in the Bakers Account prior to the 35<sup>th</sup> day.

While you celebrate your incredible accomplishments, now is also the perfect time to prepare your new officers for their roles and your clubs for the new year.



The Lion of Year was awarded to a most deserving member, Lion Patricia Nyereyegona the Community Services Chairperson.




Congratulations to our newest member Lion Cheryl who was inducted – so happy to have her join the Midrand Lions "family".

While the event was full of fun and laughter, it also served a meaningful purpose. Funds raised on the night will go directly toward the various community service projects of the Club.








Lion Colleen personally made 60 beanies for underprivileged children and donated them to Umgeni hospital and a pre preschool at a Church in Howick.








A tree planting ceremony was a wonderful way to end the learning experience.






Lions Margie and Sally and other members so enjoy bringing fun and games to the little warriors whilst they are in hospital bravely enduring their treatment.



The voting for the Board Members who will lead the Club during the 2025-2026 fiscal year took place at the June Alberton Lions Monthly GBM.




Smart Meals delivered to the SASSA pensioners to ensure that they have food for the rest of the month.


